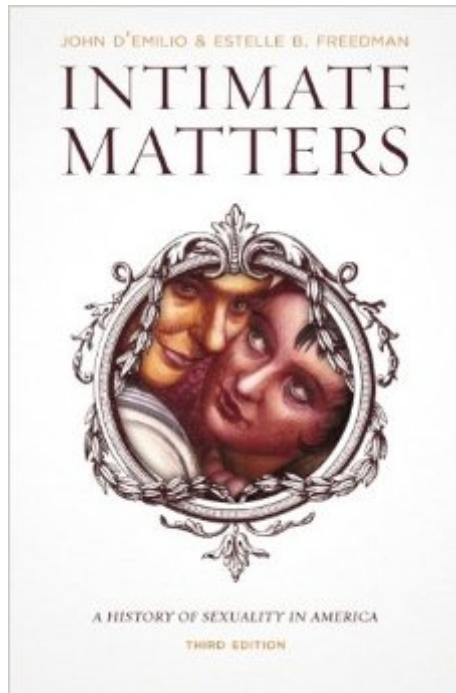


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Intimate Matters: A History Of Sexuality In America, Third Edition

This book is far from a complete history. It focuses on white middle-class sexuality, which excludes people of other ethnicities. By excluding so many people the authors created a very biased, one-dimension view of American sexuality. This book is littered with biased commentary, and it can be very dry and boring in many sections. However, one of the better things about this books is the material is grouped together in reasonable time frames, so studying from it can be useful. However, the unfortunate touting of Margaret Sanger as some sort of saint is extremely offensive and off-putting. As a woman of color I find it extremely questionable when the authors completely disregard how Sanger was a flaming bigot. Overall the book does a horrific injustice to how race, class, and gender all interact together. The book does an ok job on dealing with class and gender for middle-class white people. Again, ethnic minorities were ignored and relegated to minor foot-notes, if at all. I would not recommend this book in a Sociology class, as it can create very ugly, tense divides in a class.
